### **Akindele Oyeyemi, Ogbomosho**

Seeking of volunteers to form a network or coalition from people living in the host location from Secondary schools and tertiary institutions

### **Bosun Olanrewaju, Ibadan**

I was able to get started with the serious and motivated volunteers that also want to join hands with me for this initiative. We will start a club to reach out to young Nigerians.

### **Muktar Gadanya, Kano**

In an effort to increase the awareness of the populace especially the Youth on the issue of internet safety, problems of internet base, and internet facilitated fraud and the positive use of the internet for development the following activities were carried out:

- a) Active collaboration with Dini Digital in Kano. The General Manager and the Chief Engineer A. Shehu, along with the other key staff of Dini Digital, consented to deliver an hourly lecture weekly to either selected high-hours internet café users or internet café managers (on alternate weeks). We have had two sessions of such lecture so far. Dini Digital in addition offered to configure their systems in their cafes to display as home pages the website of internet safety campaign groups (including PIN, Microsoft, etc) for a period of 4 weeks. In addition to the "5 minutes remaining reminder" to café users, they will flash accompanying message of "Shun Internet misuse and fraud, they are dangerous ventures!" on screens.
- b) AKTH café and Dini Café have agreed to include regular messages from us on their email updates to their users and subscribers. One of such email newsletter update has already been sent to over 183 individuals and we have received some emails from individuals who received such emails, asking for more details;
- c) We are currently compiling resources and links to resources on preventing, detecting and consequences of internet misuse and fraud.

### **Ogaga E. Maxwell, Warri**

I succeeded in raising a team of young people who are committed to internet safety. I currently have people in Ughelli, Sapele, Abraka, Ozoro and some who would run two or three locations for the project in Delta State.

### **Oluwakorede Asuni, Minna**

- a) Completed the conception, design and implementation of [www.GovernmentSecondarySchoolMX.org](http://www.GovernmentSecondarySchoolMX.org), in phases thus:
  - (i) Design: Conceptualized the system and discussed principal characteristics with stakeholders (members of the web development/management team put in place by the school authority);
  - (ii) Implementation: Agreed with team and obtained domain name and suitable host package (for two years);
  - (iii) Placed completed work online, tested along with members of the team;
  - (iv) Presented finished work to the school on the 10<sup>th</sup> of February, 2009 and to the public on the 19<sup>th</sup> of February, 2009;
- b) Visited the Government Secondary School, Kutigi, which presented the winner of the second place prize at the MISSPIN National quiz competition.

- b) Set up team in Calabar to commence work on the projects;
